

## ITB #26-21 FUEL CONTRACT

1. Please confirm that the requested pricing index is Same Day Delivery 10am OPIS Net Contract Avg. **For purposes of this solicitation, the pricing benchmark shall be the Atlanta GA OPIS Contract (10:00 a.m.) Average Gross Price for the applicable fuel product on the day of delivery/loading. Bidders shall apply their proposed markup or discount to that benchmark.**
2. Is the requested invoice Gross or Net? **The County's fuel invoices reflect both gross and net gallon quantities. The invoiced quantity and pricing are based on the net gallons delivered. Bidders should base invoicing on net gallons.**
3. Are the renewal terms mutual or unilateral? **Already established the renewal terms are mutual.**
4. What are the payment terms? **Net 30**
5. What is the anticipated award date? **4-6 weeks from the deadline, after BOC approval**
6. May the awarded vendor adjust fuel supply and delivery prices, provided with sufficient evidence, on the contract anniversary date to match current market conditions? **No. Fuel pricing under this contract shall be based on the applicable OPIS benchmark plus or minus the bidder's awarded differential. The OPIS benchmark will fluctuate with market conditions. The awarded differential shall remain fixed throughout the contract term, including any renewal periods.**
7. Will electronic signatures (DocuSign) be accepted? **All bid documents must be included in the submitted paperwork.**
8. Due to copyright laws, vendors are unable to post the OPIS line item on their respective invoices. Would the County consider waiving this requirement? May the vendor provide an OPIS breakdown via email upon a County request instead? **The County will accept invoices that do not display the OPIS benchmark price. However, the awarded vendor shall maintain documentation supporting the applicable OPIS benchmark and invoice calculation and shall provide such documentation to the County upon request.**
9. Will electronic invoices be accepted instead of soft copies? **Either is acceptable.**
